How to Write the Daily Diary

Follow these questions while asking or writing the Daily Diary:

1. **Subject & Teacher:** Write the name of the subject and the subject teacher.
2. **Topic:** Write a short description of the topic that was taught.
3. **Board Work:** Write about whatever the teacher wrote on the board to explain the topic.
4. **Explanation:** Write about what the teacher taught and the extra references given to explain the topic.
5. **Doubts:** Note the concepts, words, or topics that are not clear to you.
6. **Work Given:** Write about the homework and classwork given by the teacher.

Guidelines for Grade 4 and Above

Students of Grade 4 and above must follow all the steps mentioned above to write the Daily Diary. They should **write the narration themselves** and submit the Daily Diary to their parents every day.

Note:

The Daily Diary must be kept with the parents. Students need not carry it to school. Parents must present the Daily Diary and the School Handbook during the PTM to the class teacher or subject teacher for **review and evaluation of the child's study habits.**

Objective:

Daily diary writing practice is a powerful tool for learning. It enables students to revise and retain what they have listened to and learned in each subject daily. By recalling and writing from memory, the child develops the skills to **listen attentively, understand deeply, and express clearly.** This is education in its truest form.
